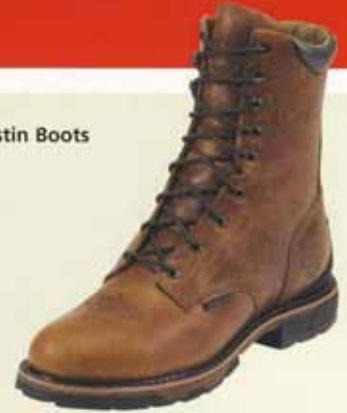


CONSTRUCTION JUNCTION

The latest looks in occupational footwear let him gear up for the tough stuff without sacrificing style or comfort. A top candidate for the job, 72240 (\$168) by **Chippewa** is a 6-inch logger in a rich bomber jacket tan. Features include a Vibram outsole and oblique toe. Ready to punch in, WK880 (\$176) by **Justin Boots** is part of the new JustinHybred collection. The 8-inch lace-up has a full waterproof bootie construction and Western round toe to give his work look a shot of Saturday night style. When the going gets tough, 4438 (\$250)—an 8-inch steel-toe style by **Red Wing**—features electrical hazard and waterproof protection, and 400 grams of Thinsulate Ultra insulation. Decked out with DynaForce technology to reduce underfoot pressure, the 4438 boot carries its own weight. Filling multiple positions, **Rocky's** Aztec style 5635 (\$150) has the functionality of a workboot, the comfort of an athletic shoe and the style of a Western-inspired casual boot. But it is Aztec's full-grain leather upper, TPU heel stabilizer, cushioned PU footbed and durable Goodyear welt construction that will show them who's boss. He'll be able to get down and dirty with the **Wolverine** EH Marauder style W02161 (\$155). The waterproof 6-inch lace-up puts in overtime with a MultiShox rubber lug comfort outsole, and contour welt stitching provides increased flexibility and support. Heavy duty meets light weight in the UL-certified composite-toe **Z-Coil Z-Duty** (\$269.95). Foot, leg and back pain get the pink slip with the brand's unique spring-suspension system, built-in orthotic, resilient cushioning and rocker sole. —*Meaghan Kerins*

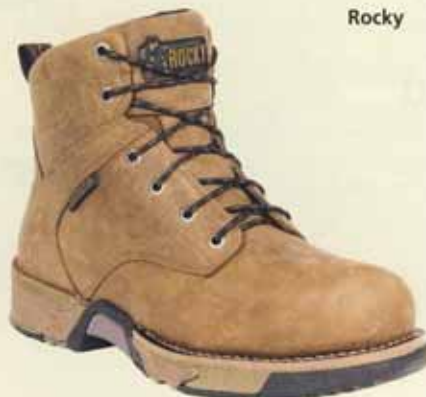
